



12. Clackamas Community College  
*Harmony Campus, Phase II*

The campus will include the Professional Business Development Center, Small Business Center, Allied Health program expansion, health care professionals education, Renewable Energy Engineering, ESL classrooms, and space for large group program delivery.

60,000 square feet

13. Southwestern Oregon Community College  
*Health and Science Technology Building*

The building will be home to science laboratories, patient simulation and clinical laboratories for nursing, EMT-Paramedic programs and medical office programs, an ambulance bay, general purpose classrooms, and a large lecture hall.

40,000 square feet

14. Rogue Community College  
*Redwood Campus Science Complex*

The Science Complex would house laboratories, offices and classrooms for science and allied health, agriculture, energy sustainability programs and landscape to articulate with Oregon State University.

63,000 square feet

1. Treasure Valley Community College  
*Science/University Center*

The Science/University Center will house labs for science, agriculture, technology, and allied health, along with classrooms and office space.

**30,000 square feet**

The Hermiston Center will provide space for laboratories and classrooms, allowing Blue Mountain to expand educational training opportunities for Allied Health and Science related occupations.

2. Blue Mountain Community College  
*Hermiston Center*



Umpqua's Health Occupations Training Center will contain laboratory and classroom space as well as offices to support health and public safety services.

The first phase of the new comprehensive McMinnville campus will house health care education programs as well as general classrooms, laboratories and office space.

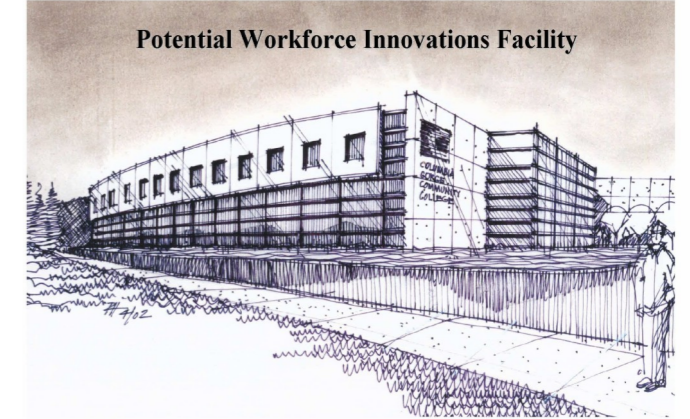

5. Columbia Gorge Community College  
*Workforce Building*

The Workforce Building is designed to house laboratories for Columbia Gorge's renewable technology programs along with a one-stop center and classrooms for health care and renewable energy.

6. Central Oregon Community College  
*Technology Education Center*

The Technology Education Center will provide classrooms and laboratory space for flight instruction and aviation maintenance, automotive instruction, computer drafting, visual and graphics arts, and a computer lab.

**30,400 square feet**

7. Portland Community College  
*Center for Education*

Classrooms space, a computer laboratory, a speech pathology laboratory, faculty offices, a child care laboratory and a teaching/learning center to educate and prepare teachers for Oregon's schools.

**50,800 square feet**



8. Lane Community College  
*Center for Energy Efficiency*

This downtown campus building will be a multi-use facility designed to demonstrate the highest standard in energy, water, and waste stream efficiency.
